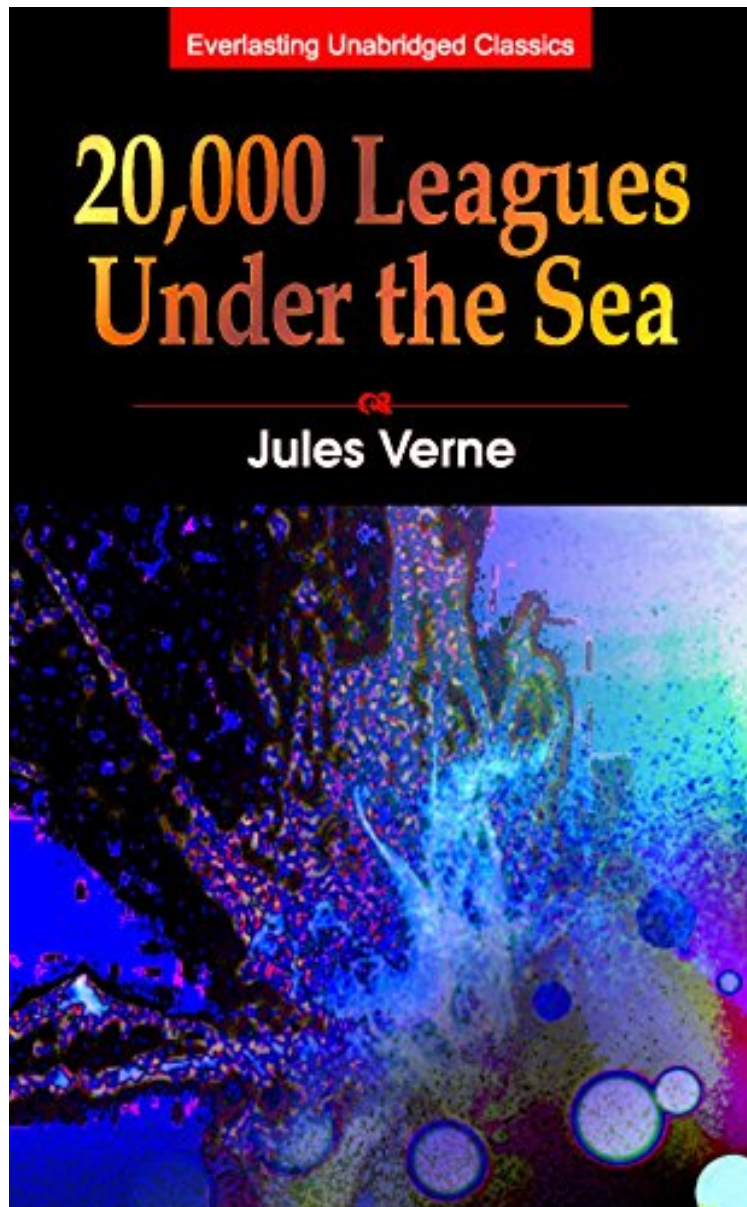

In my memory, those were fantastic and exciting books, but after finishing TTLUTS, I think my memory possibly mixed up Verne and H.G. Wells or I had been reading special teenager editions. TTLUTS is of course no modern book. The pace of the story is nothing but slow, the author concentrates on scenes -under water mostly- in which he sometimes brings up images, but often fails to do so. But what I really disliked about the book is the larger parts of the text which is nothing but classifying animals and plants. This maybe once was looked upon as education, but I really find it boring - If I want to learn those things, I will pick up a science book. I fought to the last pages, where the main characters mysteriously are saved. And I will be saved from further books by Verne for sure.
