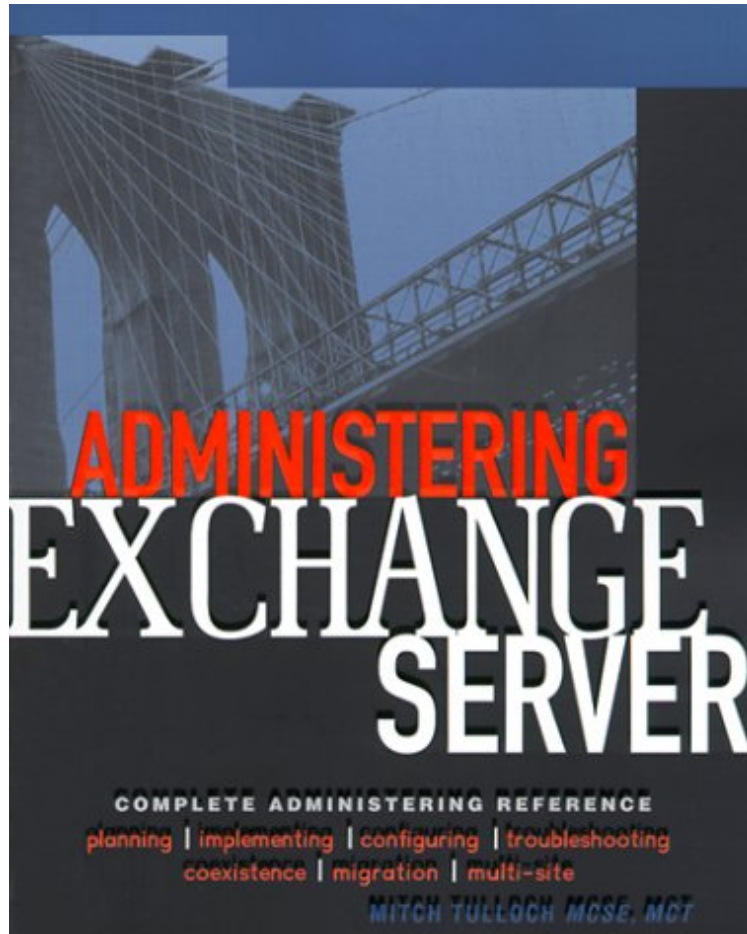

I would have rated this book a 5-star but Mitch (the author) kept misrepresenting RAID levels in various sections. For example he kept calling disk mirroring RAID 0, and disk striping (w/o parity) RAID 1. These are actually reversed with striping being RAID 0 and mirroring being RAID 1. Other than this small error the book was right on target. His writing style was very down to earth and his built in practice scenarios kept me plugging away on the server for hours just to see what I could do next. Buy it and see for
