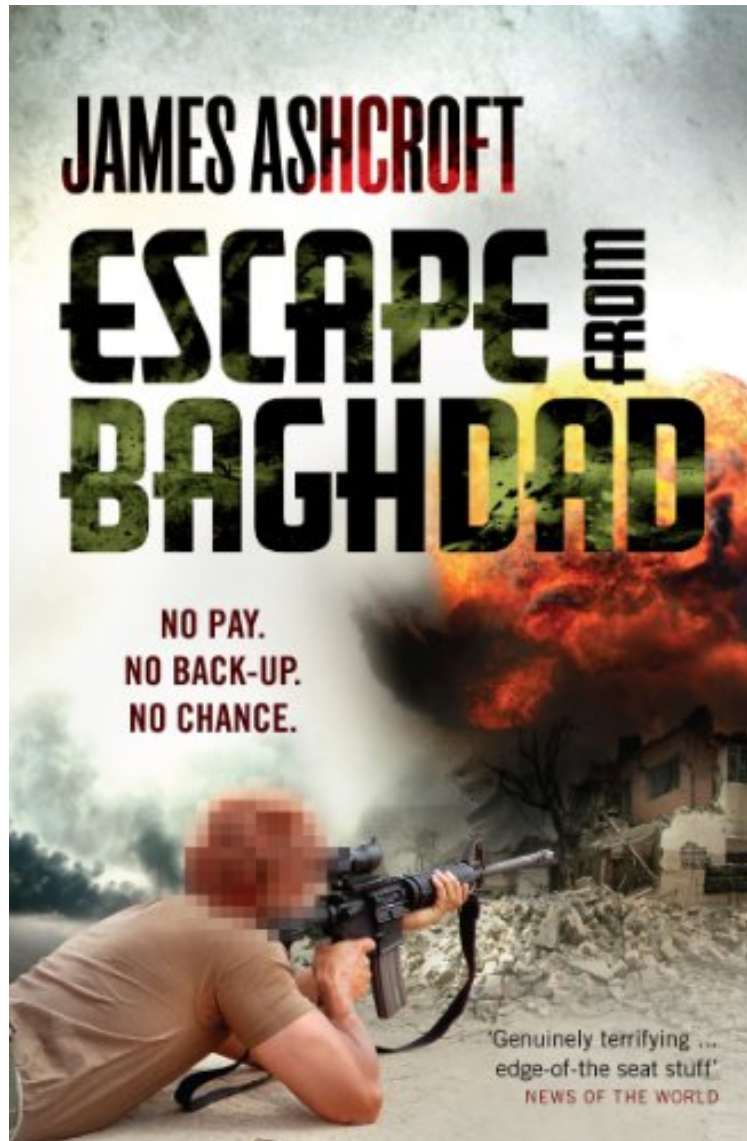

I would consider it a typical PMC (Private Military Contractor) account of events that is written very well and is quite entertaining. The South African's comments had me in stitches and I appreciate that the author is one of a few Officers out there getting their hands dirty. It's admirable (or daft?) that after Oxford and Sandhurst he would be doing PMC work along mostly NCO's in Iraq when he could have a cushy life in the city. Be that as it may, he comes across as a subtle British Officer with a stiff upper lip (literally sometimes) and a good sense of humor.
