The reader should be aware that this is a "history textbook" long on facts and at times dull. However, if one perseveres many gems of information can be gleamed from the book's pages. This is not a quick read and requires some effort to finish and absorb all the detail. It would be great

for the novice scholar or student. If you are looking for a text to give a brief and concise overview of the subject look elsewhere. The book lacks the necessary maps, figures, charts etc... to retain this readers interest for more than brief reading sessions.
