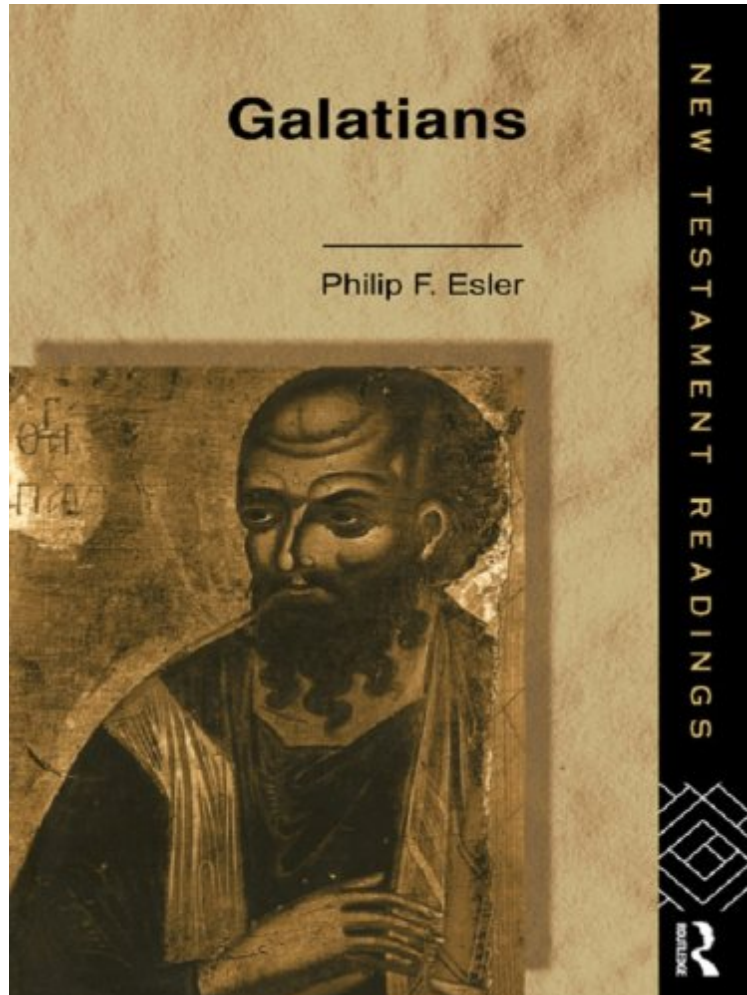

Rejecting the theological mish mash of biblical scholarship, Esler attempts to introduce the world of sociology to the reader. Seemingly a rather simple move, it is not entirely welcomed in the scholarly world. Or so Esler thinks. If you can get past Esler's stubborn stance where he seems to sleight many other scholars including Ed Sanders with some severity, then this is an interesting read. Esler attempts to bring interculturalism to the reader and show how Paul is in the oxymoronical state of being both a "stranger to our culture, and yet as the bearer of a
